INTRODUCTIONS

The meeting was called to order by Keane at 1:10 p.m. Attendees introduced themselves.

OLD BUSINESS

a. Review of 01/11/2013 meeting minutes

The meeting minutes were reviewed and approved as written.

NEW BUSINESS

a. Review monthly and YTD metrics

Millet gave an overview of the monthly and to-date reports.

Keane asked about the inclusion of Indian Health Services and the VA. Millet reported the program is working with the VA but there is not much movement with IHS.

b. Review provider survey for NIH study

Millet introduced the representatives from Accumentra, Christi Hildebran and Jessica Irvine. Irvine gave an overview of the design, goals, and recipients of the survey Accumentra designed and sent to Oregon providers.

c. Discuss SB 470A

Tom Burns led a review of Senate Bill 470A and how it has been received and revised.

d. NGA grant activities update

Burns led the discussion on the NGA grant activities. He stressed the importance of public education of prescription medication, the dangers of Opioids, drug take backs and getting this onto the Governor's agenda.

e. Federal DEA case update

Millet gave a brief update on the Federal DEA case. There has not been any movement. Oregon is still anticipating a response from the Court.

f. CLHO meeting report

Millet gave a summary of the CLHO meeting. Millet has suggested establishing a best practice for use of the PDMP in CCO's and promoting PDMP system use at the local level.

g. BJA grant announcement report

Millet outlined the BJA grant. The Oregon PDMP will apply for this grant opportunity to further develop and improve the PDMP system. The PDMP has outlined goals for improvement including training modules for PDMP users, increasing utilization of the system by implementing PDMP use policies in health systems, assessing the impact of PDMP use and reducing misuse, abuse and diversion of prescription controlled substances due to overprescribing.
